THREATENED & ENDANGERED SPECIES

U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Consultation

- The most recent Threatened and Endangered species consultation with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) as required under Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act was completed on June 12, 2013.
- Additional information obtained since completion of the previous consultation is being incorporated into the environmental assessment.
- A reinitiation of formal Section 7 consultation with the USFWS is underway.



Federally Threatened or Endangered Species and New Impacts being Addressed

- Species that the EA will assess are:
 - » Colorado River fish (Colorado pikeminnow, razorback sucker, humpback chub, and bonytail chub)
 - » Yellow-billed cuckoo
 - » Greenback cutthroat trout
 - » Dudley Bluffs twinpod
 - » Ute Ladies'-tresses
- The EA will analyze the indirect effects of combusting Trapper Mine coal at the Craig Generating Station.
- No candidate or species proposed for listing is associated with the Project Area.
