

OFFICIAL NOTICE

Pursuant to Title 40, Section 1506.6 of the Code of Federal Regulations, the Office of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement (OSMRE), Denver Field Branch, gives notice of the availability of a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) prepared in response to our receipt and analysis of the Trail Mountain Coal Refuse Fires Environmental Assessment (EA). The EA examines potential environmental impacts related to an Abandoned Mine Land (AML) reclamation project in the Manti-La Sal National Forest, Emery County, Utah.

The Trail Mountain Coal Refuse Fires AML project involves excavating, quenching, regrading, and revegetating several piles of coal waste, ignited by the 2018 Trail Mountain wildfire, at the former Helco Mine and Seagull Mine in Emery County, Utah. The project area is approximately 2.05 acres and lies within public lands managed by the US Forest Service. OSMRE is providing funding to the Utah Division of Oil, Gas & Mining's Abandoned Mine Reclamation Program to complete this project.
